
### Workshop

### 'Introduction to sexuality & gender'

Be introduced to LGBTQIA+ identity and the barriers LGBTQIA+ people face in everyday life. Empower yourself with tools to become an inclusive leader.

This workshop will include:

- the tools to build safe and inclusive experiences for colleagues and clients
- key concepts and definitions of sex, gender and sexuality
- evidence based barriers LGBTQIA+ people face at work and accessing services
- practical tools to support LGBTQIA+ people interpersonally and professionally
- LGBTQIA+ lived-experiences via our expert workshop presenters as they talk about their personal journeys being LGBTQIA+.



## Janet Cheong (she/her) Occupational Therapist, Autism Spectrum Australia (Aspect)

Janet Cheong is an occupational therapist with over 30 years of experience in early childhood, community child health, disability and autism practice. She has worked at Aspect for the past 8 years, as a clinician, behaviour support practitioner and OT clinical supervisor, in both Sydney and Melbourne. Her current role includes a clinical caseload, OT supervision, an outreach service to Tasmania and delivering workshops. Janet is passionate about supporting autistic individuals and their support networks through a neuro-affirming and capacity-building practice lens.



### **Tom Broadley** (he/him) Autism Liaison Officer, Autism Spectrum Australia (Aspect)

Tom is an autistic adult who came in contact with Autism Spectrum Australia at the age of 20 with the intention of developing his social skills and engaging in activities in his local community. Tom developed a passion for assisting his peers to achieve their goals; so much so that in 2021 he was offered the innovative role of Autism Liaison Officer at Aspect Adult Community Services. This is an opportunity that Tom has enjoyed immensely, even though he has found it can be challenging at times.



### Workshop

### 'A different brilliant - understanding, accepting and embracing autism and neurodiversity'

Neurodiversity is a movement that is fundamentally about acknowledging, respecting and celebrating difference. This moves away from the medical model that seeks to fix something defective, and towards a model that supports people to be themselves, to feel comfortable to remove the mask, and to live without barriers to participation and success. This workshop seeks to build understanding of neurodiversity, including the latest information and thinking about autism and ADHD, including their interrelationship and autism gender differences. Tom will share snippets of his lived experience of growing up autistic and what life is like as an autistic adult. This will be an interactive session where you are invited to ask questions, bring up points for further discussion, and participate in small group discussion. We hope that as student leaders, you will be able to contribute to a world that is genuinely accepting and inclusive of autism, ADHD and other neurodivergence.

Aspect and VU have a Major Alliance partnership in place aimed at improving the health and wellbeing for people on the autism spectrum. Aspect have opened Australia's first on-campus community centre for autistic adults at VU's St Albans Campus. The centre pioneers a new on-campus model. It creates positive outcomes for adult participants through programs, therapy and education, and VU students through placements and employment pathways into the disability sector.

Sless is author of two books: Mistress of Mirth's COMEDY Tour, an adaptation of her Masters by Research in Creative Writing from La Trobe University, and Measured Silk & Other Stories - fourteen linked stories about loneliness. connection and belonging. Justine's short stories have been awarded prizes, and appeared in anthologies and academic journals. She is working on a new collection of short stories and has completed a novel that will be published in 2025. Justine has written numerous comedy shows and performed at comedy festivals and events nationally and internationally. She also teaches comedy in schools and workplaces.
