

Representative sport history

Competitive sport involving Australian universities has a long and proud tradition with competitions in Rowing, Rugby, Athletics and Australian Rules dating back to the late 19th century. More recently national and regional College of Advanced Education (CAE) competitions were established in the early 1970's and conducted up to 1992. With the merger of the university and college sectors in the early 1990's the numbers of universities and students involved increased dramatically. In recent times Australian Universities have competed in a range of national championships in over forty team and individual sports at national and regional University Games and championships. Australia is also an active member of FISU, the body governing international university sport, and is represented in World University Games (Universiades) and Championships.

In 2018, Australian University Games transitioned to a divisional, national championship model. The Nationals are comprised of two flagship events, the UniSport Nationals Div 1 and 2, and a number of standalone competitions throughout the year, including Nationals Snow, Indigenous Nationals, T20 cricket, 3x3 basketball, triathlon, and others. UniSport Nationals provide quality and spirited competition attracting increasingly competitive individuals and teams and the opportunity for students to meet people across campuses and colleges of VU and all over Australia. Victoria University has a proud record of performance at University Championships, 2024 has seen another outstanding year of student sporting achievements and we look forward to seeing what success 2025 brings.

2024 Representative Sport

In 2024, the inter-university and clubs programs were in full swing with some impressive performances and hallmark vulture spirit displayed.

The 2024 sporting year commenced with the University Basketball League (UBL), which featured a challenging 9-week home-and-away schedule, including interstate matchups against the University of Sydney and the University of Sunshine Coast. The men's team displayed impressive resilience with a fresh roster, while the women's team shone brightly, advancing to the quarterfinals before narrowly losing to the University of Sydney.

The basketball action continued with two teams representing VU at the 3x3 Championships on the Sunshine Coast. The women's team demonstrated determination in a fiercely contested Division 1, while the men's team triumphed, claiming the gold medal in Division 2.

VU students also participated in a variety of other inter-university events, including UniSport Nationals Athletics and swimming, Southern Shield Netball Tournament, and UniLax Lacrosse competition.

Paralympic medallist and former world champion shot putter Todd Hodgetts OAM once again donned the VU colours, securing a silver medal at the Uni Nationals Athletics.

Following rigorous trials, training, and practice games, 70 students, led by captains Casidhe Green and Hamish Inglis, proudly represented VU at the 2024 UniSport Nationals in Canberra. The VU Vultures demonstrated outstanding athleticism and team spirit across the sports of AFL 9s Mixed, Basketball (Men and Women), Beach Volleyball (Men), Football (Soccer) (Men), Netball (Women), and Taekwondo (Women).

Notable performances included Sarah Upton, an elite taekwondo athlete pursuing a Bachelor of Paramedicine, who clinched gold in her division for the second consecutive year. Five out of six teams progressed to the medal rounds, with the AFL 9s team securing silver, the men's beach volleyball duo earning bronze, and both the men's football and women's basketball teams finishing in the national top four. The women's netball team also claimed silver in Division 2, marking an exceptional year of competition for VU





2024 Victoria Univeristy Sport Awards

The University's Sport Awards is managed by the VU Sport Department. VU Sport offers sporting opportunities to students including sporting clubs, representative sport, elite athlete support and scholarships, campus based sporting competitions and the management of sport and fitness facilities and health services.

The Sport Awards system endeavours to:

- Recognise and reward the outstanding sporting achievement of individual students representing the University
- Encourage students to represent the University and improve the overall performance at national competitions
- Recognise and reward the outstanding sporting achievement of individual students representing state or country
- Strengthen and further develop University sport clubs
- Increase awareness of sporting opportunities

The Sport Awards Committee meet each year to consider nominations for the following awards:

BLUES (INDIVIDUAL AWARDS) AWARDED FOR

Outstanding performance representing the University at regional and national championships. Australian selection at World student Games and championships. World Championship, Olympic or Commonwealth Games selection. Outstanding performance at state or national championship and outstanding performance for a University Club.

SERVICE AWARDS

Awarded to individuals who have provided outstanding service to the development and maintenance of sporting clubs and representative teams of the University (students and non students).

COLOURS

Awarded to each student who represented the University in a medal winning team at an Australian University Championship.

SPORTS TEAM OF THE YEAR

Awarded for outstanding team achievement at the Australian University Games or at an Australian University Championship for that year.

SPORT CLUB OF THE YEAR

Awarded to club has achieved significant success and improvement. Delivered outstanding participation, performance and/or development outcomes and demonstrated an inclusive and positive club culture.

OUTSTANDING SERVICE AWARD

Awarded to members of the VU community (student, staff, alumni or other individuals) who have shown outstanding service to sport at the University as either a plyer, coach, volunteer and/or administrator.

CLUB COMPETITOR AWARD

Where a student has rendered exceptional sporting service to a University club in that they have won the senior best player award and polled in top 10 of association best player award.

RISING STAR AWARD

Awarded to a student in their first year of study considered to have achieved outstanding sporting performance with great potential for future success in their sport.

SPORTS PERSON OF THE YEAR

Awarded to the best performed student for that year (Male and female).

JACINTA CARROLL ACADEMIC AND SPORTING **EXCELLENCE AWARD**

Where a student has achieved outstanding performance both sporting and academically.

HALL OF FAME

Where a Full Blue holder has achieved outstanding sustained performance in sport, completed studies at Victoria University and has retired from elite level sport.

Victoria University (VU) students and alumni once again represented Australia at some of the world's most prestigious sporting events, with five exceptional athletes competing in the 2024 Olympic and Paralympic Games in Paris. With the VU community cheering them on, these athletes showcased their dedication and talent on the global stage.

Olympic and Paralympic Games

Leon Sejranovic made history with a bronze medal at the 2023 World Taekwondo Championships and followed it up with an impressive 2024 Olympic debut in Paris.

Fellow student Aoife Coughlan, a Commonwealth Games gold medallist, returned to the Olympic stage for the second time in judo, continuing her legacy as a top performer. Aoife was supported by her sister Maeve Coughlan, a VU alumna and elite athlete, who served as her training partner in Paris.

Liam Adams a VU alumnus represented Australia in the marathon at his third Olympic Games, while Sergei Evglevski (Pistol Shooting) VU alumnus had his eye on the prize in his second Games.

Danni Di Toro, VU alumna and true legend of sport made an extraordinary eighth Paralympic appearance. Competing in Para-table tennis, Danni has earned multiple international medals across her illustrious career, including in wheelchair tennis, and her journey continues to inspire.

VU student Bianca Puglisi was the first Australian UniRoo to cross the finish line at the 2024 FISU World University Cross Country Championships in Oman. Battling extreme 35-degree heat and desert terrain, Bianca secured a 21st place finish in a highly competitive field of 31 athletes.

"I have been incredibly excited for this competition and I am so ecstatic with my result," Puglisi said. I was nervous about the conditions but knew we were all in the same boat. I felt comfortable and I am happy with my execution and how smart I ran. It has been an amazing experience and I have learnt a lot from the opportunity."

In "polar" opposite conditions VU student Saffron Canny-Smith showcased her skills on the ice as Australia's sole representative at the FISU World University Speed Skating Championships in Norway.


