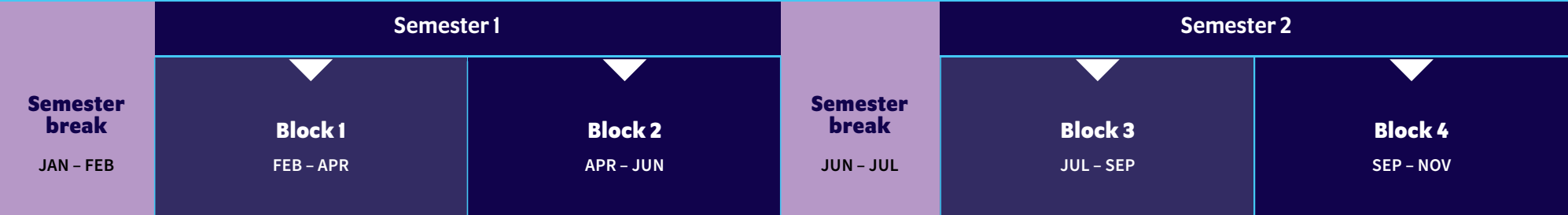

Melbourne, the capital city of Victoria, consistently ranks among the world’s most liveable cities. With a diverse and inclusive population of over five million, the city offers excellent quality of life in a safe, attractive environment with endless opportunities, inspiration and entertainment.

There’s an extensive and reliable public transport network of trains, trams and buses, meaning you can easily travel to all parts of the city and outer suburbs, including VU campuses.

It’s also affordable to use VLine trains to explore the beautiful scenery, beaches and country towns of regional Victoria.

With a strong job market across a variety of industries, Melbourne offers great opportunities to support your studies through part-time work and gain valuable postgraduate work experience.



Work opportunities

Melbourne offers a wealth of employment opportunities across various industries, from casual work in areas like retail, hospitality and customer service to graduate positions in healthcare, technology, engineering, education and so much more. It’s the perfect place to get international work experience, develop new skills and kick-start your career.

Before applying for jobs in Melbourne, check in with our VU Careers Hub team to get the best support, including interview practice, access to our online job search and information about work rights. Australia has strong regulations to protect the rights of all workers, including international students. As of July 2025, the minimum wage in Australia is \$24.95 per hour, but check the website below for updates and further information.

While you study

Many international students choose to work while living and studying in Melbourne. An Australian Student visa (subclass 500) allows you to work part-time up to 48 hours per fortnight and full-time during semester breaks.

Working part-time is a great way to support yourself, develop skills and meet new people. The VU Block Model teaching method offers focused and flexible timetables to help you balance study with work.

As an international student, you are required to maintain course enrolment and ensure satisfactory attendance and progress. We strongly advise you to keep up to date with any changes to your visa conditions, including work rights, such as the number of hours you are permitted to work.

After you graduate

If you’re interested in staying in Australia to work after you graduate, you’ll need to get a relevant working visa before your student visa expires. There are two options available to you under the Temporary Graduate visa (subclass 485): the Post-Higher Education Work stream and the Post-Vocational Education Work stream.

The qualification you use to meet the Australian study requirement determines the stream you can apply for. Both visas let you live, study and work in Australia for a temporary period of time. Please note that the maximum eligible age for a Temporary Graduate visa is 35 years or under at the time of application, or under 50 years for postgraduate research students.

Fees and living costs

Before you start your studies, it’s a great idea to prepare a budget based on your lifestyle and accommodation choices. This page offers an indication of some of the main expenses of studying and living in Melbourne.

Tuition fees

Your tuition fees will be outlined in your offer letter. You will need to pay a tuition fee deposit to accept your offer. After you start your course, you’ll be invoiced for each unit (subject) before it starts. Tuition fees vary by course and may change.

Study costs

You might need to buy equipment, textbooks and clothing (like uniform) for some courses. These costs are separate from your tuition fees. Allow approximately A\$650 for books and stationery each year, with some courses requiring additional payments for compulsory equipment or uniforms.

Living costs

As a condition of your student visa you must have enough money to pay the first year costs of your stay, including your travel and living expenses.

The Australian Government currently expects all new international students to have A\$29,710 in savings, with extra funds available for any accompanying relatives.

Living expenses include accommodation, groceries, entertainment and transport.

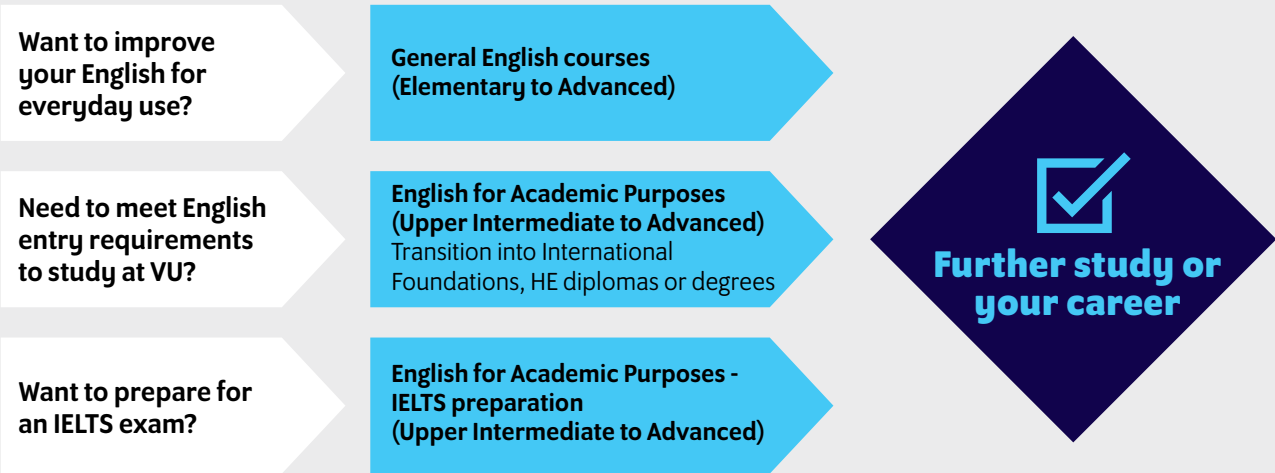

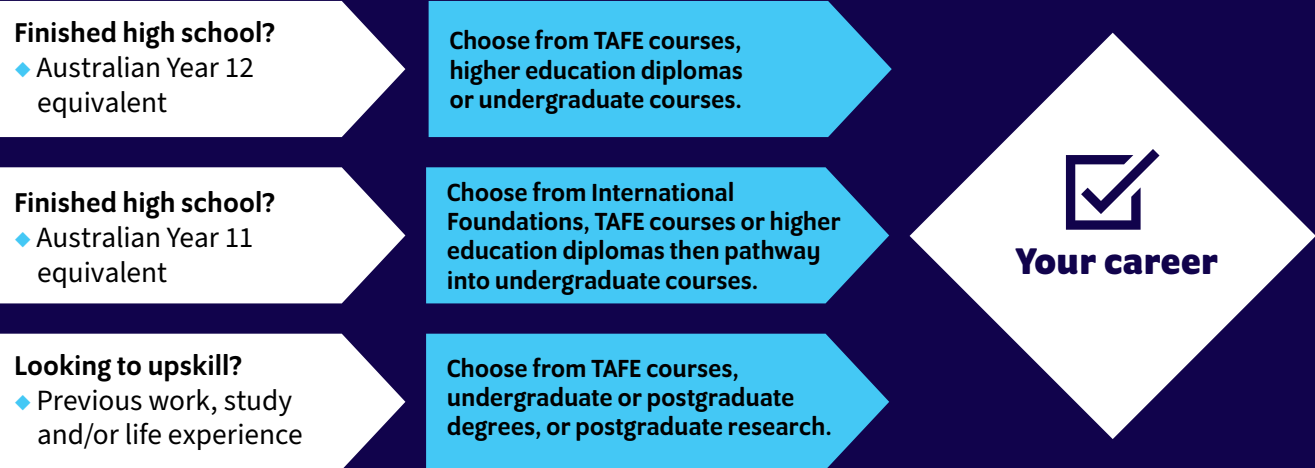

What is credit?

Most Higher Education subjects (units) equal 12 credit points. If you’re studying full time, you’ll generally complete a total of eight subjects per year – that’s four subjects in semester one and four subjects in semester two.

For pathways that grant credits: 48 credit points is equivalent to four subjects or one semester of study (six months), 96 credit points is equivalent to eight subjects or two semesters of study (one year) and 144 credit points is equivalent to 12 subjects or three semesters of study (one and a half years).

To study at Victoria University as an international student, you need to meet our academic and English language entry requirements. For a complete list of academic entry requirements and international equivalencies, follow the QR code below or visit:

Meeting the minimum academic entry requirements means you are eligible to apply for a course but does not guarantee your entry.

You may also be required to meet additional selection criteria such as minimum age, prerequisites, personal statement, or an interview or audition, which are considered alongside academic qualifications.

Please note that some courses may also receive more applications than the number of places available.

You need to meet our English language entry requirements in order to study as an international student. You must provide evidence that you’ve completed an approved English language test, usually no more than two years prior to commencing your studies. Arrange your student visa through the Australian Department of Home Affairs. Visa processing times can vary, so apply as soon as you receive your Confirmation of Enrolment (CoE) from VU.
