## Structured Workplace Learning

The Victorian Curriculum and Assessment Authority (VCAA) has determined that Structured Workplace Learning (SWL) is a valuable component of all VET qualifications undertaken by VCE (including Vocational Major) and VPC students.

VCAA strongly recommends that students undertake a minimum of 80 hours of SWL over the duration of the VCE VET Certificate II in Building and Construction Pre-apprenticeship with a focus on carpentry.


