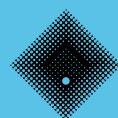

Moondani Balluk means 'embrace people' in the Woiwurrung language of the Wurundjeri people.

- ◆ Sharing of Aboriginal knowledge and to integrate Aboriginal practices into its curricula, research and work

- ◆ A commitment to pursuing political and social justice, equity, and access to education for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people
- ◆ Accountability to Aboriginal cultural values, protocols and norms.

Moondani Balluk assists all students with:

- ◆ ABSTUDY applications and other financial assistance
- ◆ Course and enrolment advice
- ◆ Academic support through tutoring and mentoring, and use of computer and photocopying facilities
- ◆ Access to the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Resource Library
- ◆ Social support through our campus locations, cultural awareness activities, community organisations and events
- ◆ Referral to counselling
- ◆ Referrals and support in housing and finance matters
- ◆ Career and employment advice through cadetships, work experience and job listings.

All Moondani Balluk staff maintain close links and relationships with the Koori community, working closely with the Office of Aboriginal Affairs Victoria, Local Aboriginal Network, the Department of Justice Western Metropolitan Regional Aboriginal Justice Advisory Committee, the Department of Human Services Indigenous Family Violence Regional Action Group, local members of the Koori community in the western suburbs of Melbourne and Aboriginal statewide organisations.

THE UNIVERSITY MACE — AN ESTABLISHED TRADITION

Our graduation ceremonies begin with the entrance of the University mace, signifying the authority of the Chancellor. Carried by the Mace Bearer, the mace symbolises learning, scholarship and our rich history. The mace connects us with those who have come before and those who will follow in the pursuit of learning. Made of sterling silver and 24-carat gold, the design includes the letter ‘V’, standing for Victoria – our University’s home and namesake.

ACADEMIC DRESS

Wearing academic dress on ceremonial occasions is a celebrated university tradition, and generally consists of a gown (also known as a robe) with a separate hood (also known as a stole), and usually a cap – doctoral candidates wear a bonnet. Throughout the Commonwealth, universities usually follow the academic dress style of Oxford or Cambridge. Our academic dress is based on the Oxford style. Traditionally, the Chancellor's gown is faced in gold and the Vice-Chancellor's gown is faced in silver.

The colour of the hood (stole) identifies the discipline:

The gowns worn by graduating students help distinguish undergraduate and higher degrees:

- ◆ undergraduates and postgraduates wear a black gown – Vocational Education, Further Education and undergraduate gowns have a large slit in each sleeve
- ◆ the masters gown has a long narrow sleeve extension
- ◆ doctoral candidates wear a red gown.

Masters – a black gown and black cap with a black hood fully lined with the discipline colour.

Doctors – a black bonnet with a gold cord, a scarlet gown with a facing and a black hood fully lined with the discipline colour.

First Nations/Indigenous

Australians – The academic dress of your award is worn together with a calf length black and patterned silk stole that has the Moondani Balluk name and a portion of the Moondani Balluk logo.

ACADEMIC DRESS FOR PARTICULAR AWARDS IS AS FOLLOWS:

Certificates – a black cap and an undergraduate gown with a black stole with a facing of tangerine.

Diplomates and Graduate

Certificates – a black cap and an undergraduate gown with a black stole with a facing in the discipline colour.

Bachelors – a black gown and black cap with a black hood half lined with the discipline colour. The hood for the honours degree has a white band on the edge of the hood.

The logo design is evocative of the western region of Melbourne. The black lines represent boomerangs that speak to the return of knowledge to the Aboriginal community from the University and from the Aboriginal community to the University. The eel shape represents the Traditional Owner food source while the line designs within represent Traditional Owner land, culture, law and connection as continual. The bora ring shapes in the left hand side stole panel represent Indigenous knowledge, respect and justice, and our relationships to land, culture, Elders and lore.

In official abbreviations of our awards, Victoria University is abbreviated to VicMelb.

It was mathematically-modelled producing an energy expression, namely 'Celalettin's 1st Paradigm'. The model technique involves an external electron source that engages a pump beam used to pierce a Spin Polarised Electron Gas (SPEG), where its frequency is calibrated to the Electron Dipole Spin Resonance frequency. Collectively, this forms a tunnel of individually spin-flipped electrons in the SPEG, enabling the electron to be observed and measured. The formulations and derivations will be exploited or a variety of future quantum applications in engineering and medical applications.

The study's empirical contribution is founded on the principal 'what is measured can be managed'. Adopting a systems-level view, the study reveals contentious aspects of informal recycling in Pakistan and some leverage points to improve recycling and re-engineer product development.

George Pappas, AO

Victoria University is proud to honour George Pappas AO and recognise his significant contributions to Victoria University, higher education, business, medical research and the west of Melbourne over his exceptional lifetime.

George Pappas AO was the fourth Chancellor of Victoria University from 2010 until he retired in 2019, after his second five-year term of appointment. He brought to Victoria University his vast life and business experience, deep connections with the Melbourne business community, and a brilliant strategic mind.

This passion extended to his commitment to the University's student-centric mission, where George was a proud champion of our moral purpose and transforming the lives of students from diverse backgrounds, including many who are first in family to attend university. George and his wife Jill were generous donors, contributing to scholarships for asylum seekers and First Nations peoples, research appeals, our AVID program for schools, and a significant Centenary Campaign Pledge – to name a few.

As an advocate of the University's learning and teaching approach, George supported then Vice-Chancellor, Professor Peter Dawkins, to implement the revolutionary VU Block Model and further realise the University's innovative approach to enhancing student outcomes.

George was born in Greece and came to Australia with his family in 1952 when he was six, travelling the world throughout his life and career. He has a Bachelor of Economics with First Class Honours from Monash University (1968) and an MBA, with Distinction, from Harvard Business School (1971).

After graduating, George joined the Boston Consulting Group (BCG), an international management consulting firm, and later co-founded Pappas Carter Evans and Koop (PCEK) in Australia. It became the leading Australian management consultancy, providing strategic advice to the nation's largest companies. BCG eventually acquired it, where George was the Managing Partner of the Australasian offices and a member of the worldwide Executive Committee.

Since retiring in 2002, George undertook several assignments for State and Federal governments, including serving as the Under Secretary of the Victorian Premier's Department from 2003 to 2005 and leading the Audit of the Federal Defence Budget in 2008.

The Committee for Melbourne appointed George as Chairman in 2005. During his 8-year tenure, he led the Committee's effort to support new and innovative industry development and promote Melbourne's Higher Education and Biotechnology sectors.

George has served on various public and private governance bodies throughout his career. This includes chairing the Federal Government's Defence Strategic Reform Advisory Board (2009-2012) and the Advisory Board of the Monash Institute of Medical Research (now the Hudson Institute). Additionally, he was a board member of the Western Bulldogs Football Club from 2001 to 2013 and was made a life member of the club in recognition of his many years of service.

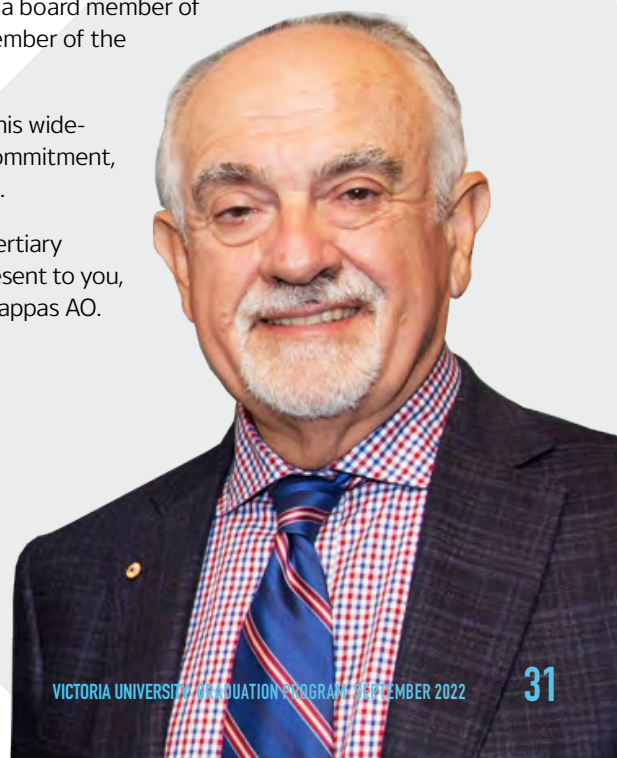

Dulce de Jesus Soares has had an extensive career as a politician committed to achieving positive change for women, families, and communities. Her background in teaching, international development and aid work has fostered her deep understanding of her local communities from a global context.

She received her Bachelor of Education from Udayana University, Bali, and her Masters in International Community Development from Victoria University, Australia. After teaching English and gaining extensive experience in regional development and planning, she worked as a national program officer for UNICEF. She collaborated with international partners to develop laws and policies to guarantee children's rights, including establishing the National Commission of Children's Rights.

As both the former Timor-Leste Vice-Minister of Preschool and Basic Education and former Minister for Education, Youth and Sport, she has played a major role in road mapping plans to ensure equal access and quality of education to all children, especially in the rural areas.

She spearheaded expansion of preschool access, reform of both the preschool and primary curricula, the commencement of local production of textbooks and didactic materials, the introduction of various legislation and curriculum laws, improvement of execution and monitoring of the mother tongue education pilot, and an inclusive education policy.

She led the Ministry in streamlining and making efficient Ministry systems, including the implementation of several feasibility studies to improve key elements of the education system.

Her commitment and passion in education brings her to a new role as the education advisor to the President of Timor-Leste.

Victoria University's engagement with Timor-Leste spans over 20 years. It has included academic collaborations with Timorese institutions, student exchange and fostering education and training opportunities to support the sustainable development of the communities of Timor-Leste. Since 2003, almost 180 Timorese students have studied in the University's Higher Education or VU Polytechnic courses.

Dulce has engaged with Victoria University for several years to support the joint mission of sustainable development for Timor-Leste's future through collaboration and education.
